2022 Highlights

In response to increased food insecurity in our community, in 2022 we launched the Buckets of Hope food drive program. So many have requested buckets for food drives at birthday parties, schools, workplaces, and even Park Meadows mall. Churches have asked for buckets for their church-wide food drives as well. We have had to order over 100 buckets just to keep up with demand, all of which have been donated by the Castle Rock Home Depot.

Through our annual Keep The Heat On! campaign and other funding sources, in 2022 HHC provided \$140,494 in emergency utility assistance for families and individuals who were at risk of being shut off or who had their utilities disconnected. Each month brings increased need. In January 2023, HHC provided \$27,128 in utility assistance, more than double the amount of January 2022.



The Center launched a mobile food pantry in the spring of 2022, bringing food and toiletry items to those in need, starting with Lincoln Pointe Lofts and Apex Meridian apartments.

Help & Hope Center works to meet the basic needs of residents of Douglas and Elbert Counties who are unemployed, underemployed, on fixed incomes, disabled, elderly, experiencing hunger and homelessness, or are at risk for these conditions.
